Hundreds Pay Respects to Joan Austin

A farm girl with a diploma from NUHS in 1948. A dreamer, an idealist, an achiever with ambition, devoted Mother and family matriarch, a successful business woman, a believer in the American dream, a leader in the community and education from primary to university — That is the Joan Austin whom hundreds came to pay their respects to at a stirring outdoor Memorial June 15th in Newberg.

After several days of clouds and rain, blue sky and sunshine immersed the audience and as if Joan was directing, an occasional breeze refreshed the outdoor assembly.

Rows of folding chairs and a special grandstand were set up in an open field, described as the Field of Dreams on the program, within the shadow of Allison Inn & Spa. Musical performances and thoughtful expressions about Joan by her grandchildren and others, including Golden Gathering member Leslie Carsley, Principal at Joan Austin Elementary were delivered from the flower decorated stage. Mrs. Carsley, Newberg High School Class of '61 introduced a group of 4th and 5th grade students who performed a

couple songs and in the introduction she reflected on her memories of Joan.

I come to you this morning with a grateful heart for the gift of Joan Austin. Joan was a woman of strong character, many wonderful skills and abilities, and great compassion. I remember vividly the evening that it was announced that I was going to be the instructional leader at Joan Austin Elementary. Both Joan and Ken welcomed me with open arms.

Joan Austin was a woman of strength and dignity. She was an inspiration to all students, staff and community at large. "Be all you can be." We can not be just like her, but we can learn from her industry, her integrity, and her resourcefulness.

Joan Austin's mantra for her school is inlaid in the floor of the front entrance to the school. It reads, "Education grants us the knowledge to pursue our dreams." That was Joan's desire for all students who attended her school. Whether it be in a kindergarten tea party, where the sugar cubes became the science experiment, the 5th grade hot chocolate and cookie Christmas Sing Along at the Allison, the Joan Austin Elementary lanyards that all students wore around their neck as they earned money for their school at the annual jog-a-thon, or getting to meet and touch the hands and feet of former Portland Trailblazer Chris Dudley, Joan wanted children to be able to follow their dreams, no matter how big.

NUHS Coach Davis Remains in The Game at 93

Ralph Davis, football coach at NUHS during 1951 and 1952, is on the path to becoming a centenarian. At 93, still physically imposing with an equally sharp mind, Coach Davis is a living testament to the benefits of a life dedicated to athleticism and staying in condition. His fitness is also attributed to a Spartan way of life that never included drinking or smoking. He was 81 before he had his first cup of coffee. His favorite beverage remains milk.

Coach Davis defies his age by playing racquetball for two hours three days a week with other aspiring nonagenarians at the Multnomah Athletic Club in Portland. This is mixed with ping pong, and golf and other creative hobbies such as designing and making paper butterflies to decorate his stationery and poetry.

Coach Davis attributes his long life to being active in a variety of things and opines that, "life is like riding a bicycle — stop pedaling and you fall over!" Not surprisingly, his advice for the quiet enjoyment of a long life is to *Keep Pedaling! Whether you feel like it or not.*

The diversity of Coach Davis storied career in coaching and sports covers a multiple of achievements over seven decades. In 1996 he and his late wife Betty were working as life guards at Seaside, OR when they founded the Seaside Beach Run.



Oregon's first marathon, the *Trails End* grew out of this, and in 1970 with mentoring by Coach Davis, District 1 & 2 of the N.A.I.A. agreed to sanction its runners in the event by recognizing their scores.


In 1983, Coach Davis trained and contributed to the selection of officials for the 1984 Olympics in LA. He coached the National Korfball team for 10 years and in 1985 in London, his team placed third in world — first time a team outside Europe had achieved that high a ranking.

He's remembered by alumni at Sheridan, Newberg, and Jefferson High School as a football coach. He also coached football at Portland State University and was a Professor of Health and Physical Education at the same university. During his 36 year tenure at PSU, he distinguished himself as track and cross country coach for over 17 years, winning two national championships. One of his favorite memories relates to a victory over a strong Lewis and Clark team when the PSU team carried him off the field, causing a sportswriter to comment that it was first time in memory a track coach had received such recognition.

Typical of Coach Davis, he selflessly places the highlight of his coaching and education career on the success of his players and students after graduation.





Austin Hall — Under Construction at Oregon State University

Named in honor of Ken and Joan Austin for their 10-million dollar commitment to the project, a new state-of-the-art College of Business building is under construction on the Oregon State University campus in Corvallis. Austin Hall, a 100,000 square-foot, five-floor-building is scheduled for completion in the fall of 2014 and will replace 90 year-old Bexel Hall.

According to the Business Dean, Ilene Kliensorge, the building will comply with US Green standards and will provide a professional atmosphere for students to work together. Ken Austin believes the building will attract a high quality student who will be more apt to stay in Oregon after graduation.

Joan's recent, unexpected death deeply saddened the OSU community. Dean Kleinsorge expressed gratitude for Joan's passion, generosity and inspiration not only for this project, but for so many others at the University.

Ken graduated in engineering from the University in 1954. Joan was named an honorary alumnus in 2005 in recognition of her service and gifts to OSU. Both have received numerous awards and honors for their philanthropy and leadership.
